Model

- British? American? New Zealand?
- What do YOU model?
- Why you can't avoid the issue
 - You can't have a non-model in front of students
 - "No right answer" encourages drift
- Why it doesn't matter and why it does



Consonants

- Individual consonants don't matter much, but some are more important than others
- Patterns of consonants may:
 - p/b, t/d, k/g
- Pick your battles



Vowels

- Speakers used to great variation in vowel qualities
- Speakers accept lack of some distinctions (Singapore then/than, cut/cart; New Zealand here/hair; Yorkshire cud/could)
- But distinctions across systems are harder: fit/feet, cot/caught/coat, bet/bait
- Gross mergers may be impossible



Stress

- Wrong stress can make words incomprehensible
- Some wrong stress will not be noticed
- Think of stress as related to vowel quality in the first instance
- Remember not all languages have schwa



Rhythm

- Stress-timed rhythm will make things sound more inner-circle
- Syllable-timed English will almost always be comprehensible



Intonation

- Intonation only important when a certain level of fluency is achieved
- The worst intonational errors come from people who speak really well
- Textbooks tend to introduce a very formal style of read English – not necessarily normal on the street



Voice quality

- Italians always sound excited; Chinese speakers always sound angry
- Some voice qualities have negative emotions associated with them – which may vary from place to place
- Avoid excesses



How do I know what to concentrate on?

- It depends on the individual
- Need to evaluate the most important points for each learner
- Remember that teachers in a particular community are captured by that community, which makes them bad judges of what is the priorities are



So overall?

- Don't ignore pronunciation
- Good pronunciation leads to good acceptance
- But pronunciation is not everything
- The best pronunciation in the world is no use if you have nothing to say
- So weight the needs of the students
